

# **COMMERCIAL PILOT LICENCE – AEROPLANE**

## **Privileges:**

Engage in providing a commercial flight services as Pilot-in-Command or Co-Pilot

- Exercise the privileges of Private Pilot Licence Aeroplane
- Exercise the privileges of a Visual Flight Rules Over-the-Top rating
- Exercise the privileges of the Night rating.
- This licence may be endorsed for daylight flying only.

# Flight Training:

A minimum of 65 hours of flight time, which must include:

- 35 hours of dual instruction
  - 5 hours must be nighttime, including 2 hours night cross-country.
  - 5 hours cross-country (the 2 hours night cross-country will be counted towards the 5 hours total time)
  - 20 hours instrument
- 30 hours solo
  - 25 hours flight time emphasizing the improvement of general flying skills, including a 300nm radius cross-country.
  - 5 hours night.

An applicant must have 200 hours of flight time for Transport Canada to sign-off the licence; 100 hours of which must be as pilot-in-command, including 20 hours cross-country.

#### **Medical Fitness:**

An applicant shall hold a valid category 1 medical certificate.

## **Ground School Training:**

A Commercial Pilot Licence applicant must attend a minimum of 80 hours of approved ground school. This course consists of a series of lectures aimed at fully preparing the student for not only the required Transport Canada examinations, but also a safe and satisfying time in the world of aviation. The subjects dealt with in the ground school include Air Law, Aeronautics, Navigation, meteorology etc.

#### Written Examination:

A Transport Canada written exam is required.

You must obtain a minimum of 60% in each of the following mandatory areas:
Air Law – Navigation – Meteorology – General Knowledge

#### Flight Test:

A flight test is required.

#### **Course Enrollment:**

Durham Flight Centre is registered as a private career college (PCC) under the *Private Career Colleges Act, 2005.* Students may enroll at any time by completing the PCC Vocational Student enrolment process and commence flight training at their convenience.

#### **Enrollment Requirements:**

Prerequisites: Have a valid Canadian Private Pilot Licence – Aeroplane

Age: No minimum age to take lessons. A commercial pilot must be at least 18 years of age to

hold the licence.

Citizenship: An applicant must be a Canadian citizen, a landed immigrant, or a person admitted into

Canada to undertake flight training.

Language: An applicant must be able to read, write, and speak in English without assistance.
